REWARD FOR RUNAWAY SLAVE

*To retrieve fugitive slaves, slave-owners offered rewards such as this one, and sometimes hired bounty hunters. It was not uncommon **for** fugitives to be re-captured years after their escapes. Search:* reward for runaway slave

During the time of slavery, announcements of rewards for the capture and return of fugitive slaves were common. Often, if a fugitive's escape was unsuccessful, he or she would try again. Search: newspaper ad: reward for runaway slave

TUSKEGEE AIRMEN: OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE PAVES THE WAY FOR CHANGE

The Tuskegee Airmen were the first squadron in World War II to avoid losing a bomber. Learn how the controversial 'experiment' proved that African Americans could fly in combat. The men in the squadron collected 150 distinguished Flying Crosses and Legions of Merit-- and gained increasing respect. While the racial divide endured back in the United State, President Harry S. Truman outlawed segregation in the U.S. military. Search: Tuskegee airmen outstanding
