



Students who are ready to enter either their Grade 7 or Grade 8 year of elementary school in September of 2016, are eligible to be considered candidates for this program. Students start in Destinations, apply to continue with Foundations for grades 9 and 10, and then are fully prepared for the International Baccalaureate Programme in their final two years of high school.

Admission Process

1. Student Application Package is due Friday, February 5, 2016.

This process MUST include the following attached documentation:

- **Cover Letter:** Explain why you are applying for the Destinations Programme (one page maximum).
- **Resume:** Students should list their parent(s)/guardian(s) name(s) and contact information, current school and grade, academic strengths, achievements, technology skills, volunteer or community experience (if applicable), statement of consent to contact current teacher and/or principal. Please do not submit reference letters.
- December 2015 Progress Report, Term 1 2016 Report Card (to be submitted upon request after the interview).
- Special Education students – latest copy of the Individual Education Plan (IEP).

*****Please note that additional Board transportation will not be available for this programme. Students may be eligible for transportation if there is space available on an existing route. TRI-Board Student Transportation Services makes this determination, generally in late August. *****

For students who are **not** currently enrolled in a Hastings and Prince Edward District School Board School, you must also submit the following:

- Copy of Student Birth Certificate/Passport

2. Student Interview: three questions and a written answer to one question. Student resumes and cover letters will be available during the interview. Please do not prepare a portfolio. Interviews will take place on Tuesday, February 16 and Wednesday, February 17, 2016.
