

Did you know there is a skilled trade shortage throughout Ontario and Canada and by 2020, it is estimated Canada may be short one million skilled trade workers!

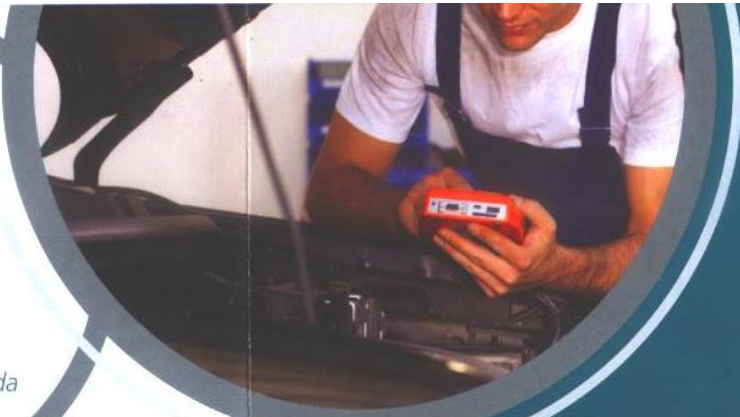
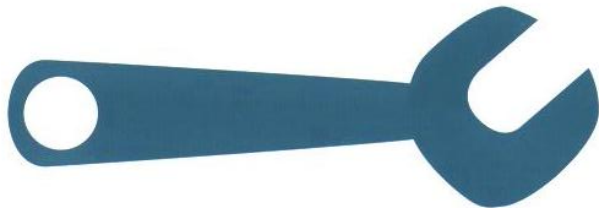

DRIVING YOUR FUTURE!

- Learn a skilled trade through hands-on training - 80 to 90% of your apprenticeship is employer-based training and 10 to 20% is in-class training
- You've always liked motorcycles, or you're fascinated by heavy equipment. Perhaps you're interested in farm machinery or recreational vehicles

Some of the duties of an automotive service technician:

- Inspect, diagnose, repair and service mechanical, electrical and electronic systems of cars, buses and trucks
- Perform scheduled maintenance services such as oil changes, tune ups and lubrications
- Advise customers of general vehicle condition and repair needs



An apprenticeship as an automotive service technician can lead to many other careers such as:

- Auto Recycler
- Automotive Journalist
- Claims Adjuster
- Leasing Service Representative and Advisor
- Truck and Transport Mechanic

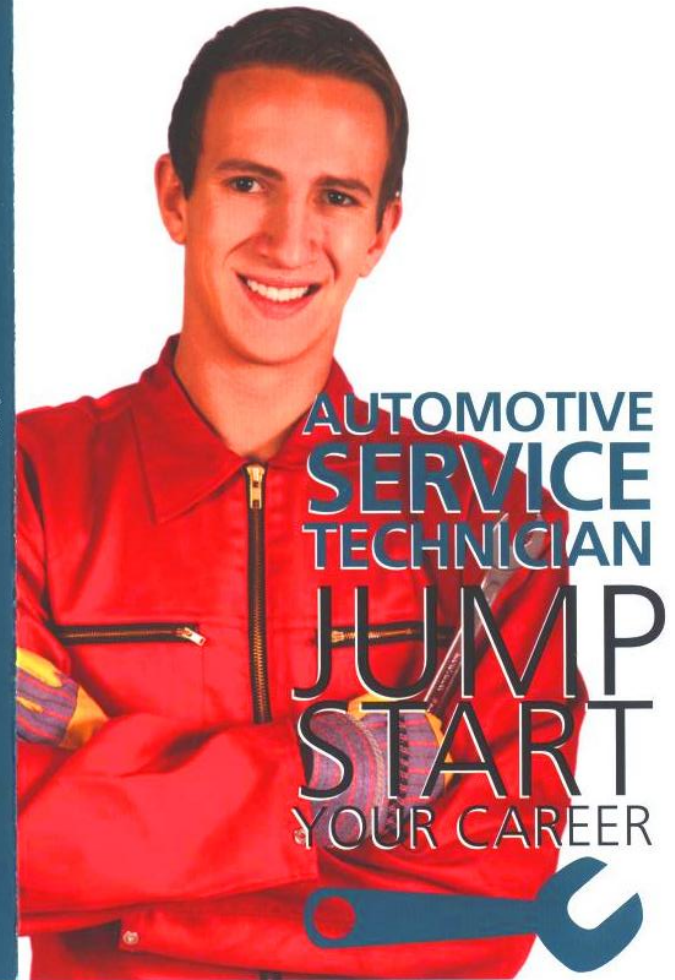

PATHWAYS

TO AN AUTOMOTIVE SERVICE TECHNICIAN APPRENTICESHIP

1. Register for a Cooperative Education Course

- Get the opportunity to complete your co-op in any of the skilled trade areas.
- This is an excellent opportunity to 'test' a trade to see if it's right for you!

2. Registered OYAP/Co-op

- Continue your co-op placement in a skilled trade area AND get registered as an apprentice with the Ministry of Training Colleges and Universities (Apprenticeship Branch).
- The hours completed at co-op will count towards the completion of your apprenticeship program.

3. Level 1 OYAP/Co-op

Registered apprentices may have the opportunity to complete the 1st level of the in-school portion of apprenticeship training.

- Attending Loyalist College, Belleville, in your grade 12 year, will provide an opportunity to complete the first in-school component (240 hours) of the Automotive Service Technician Apprenticeship program.
- Receive secondary school credits and college credits for the time spent in the cooperative education placement.
- Receive secondary school credits and college credits for the in-school time at college as well.
- Length of apprenticeship is 6500 hours (including three 240 hour in-school components).
