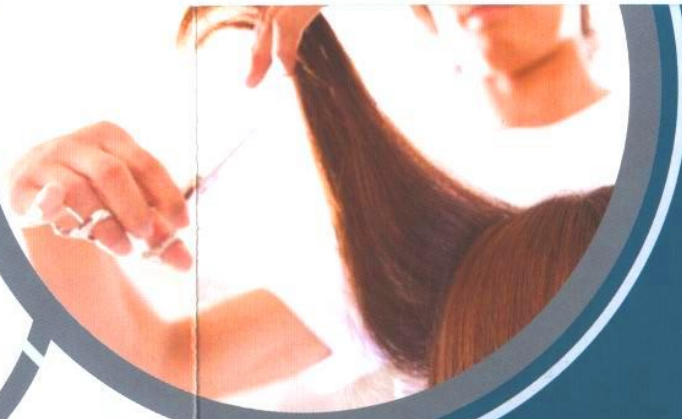


Did you know there is a skilled trade shortage throughout Ontario and Canada and by 2020, it is estimated Canada may be short one million skilled trade workers?

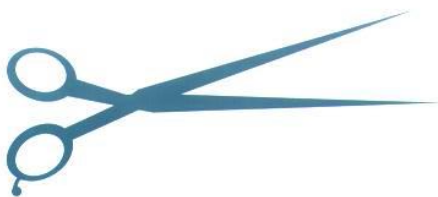


A CAREER WITH STYLE!

- Learn a skilled trade through hands-on training - 80 to 90% of your apprenticeship is employer-based training and 10 to 20% is in-class training at a Community College
- Hairstylists keep their customers looking and feeling their best.

Some of the duties performed by hairstylists:

- Shampoo, cut and style hair
- Perform more complex tasks such as colouring/highlighting, weaving or adding extensions
- Work with customer's personal tastes and fashion trends to design a hairstyle that will please them
- Use a variety of hair care products to best achieve a particular style
- Order supplies, keep records and accounts as well as other administrative duties
- Perform job duties with care and creativity



An apprenticeship as a hairstylist can lead to many careers in:

- Hairstyling or Hairdressing salons
- Barbershops
- Healthcare establishments
- Film, theatre and television productions
- Beauty Products marketing

In order to participate in OYAP, students must:

- Be 16 years of age at the time the co-op placement begins
- Have successfully completed 16 credits towards their OSSD
- Have a sincere interest in and aptitude for the skilled trade

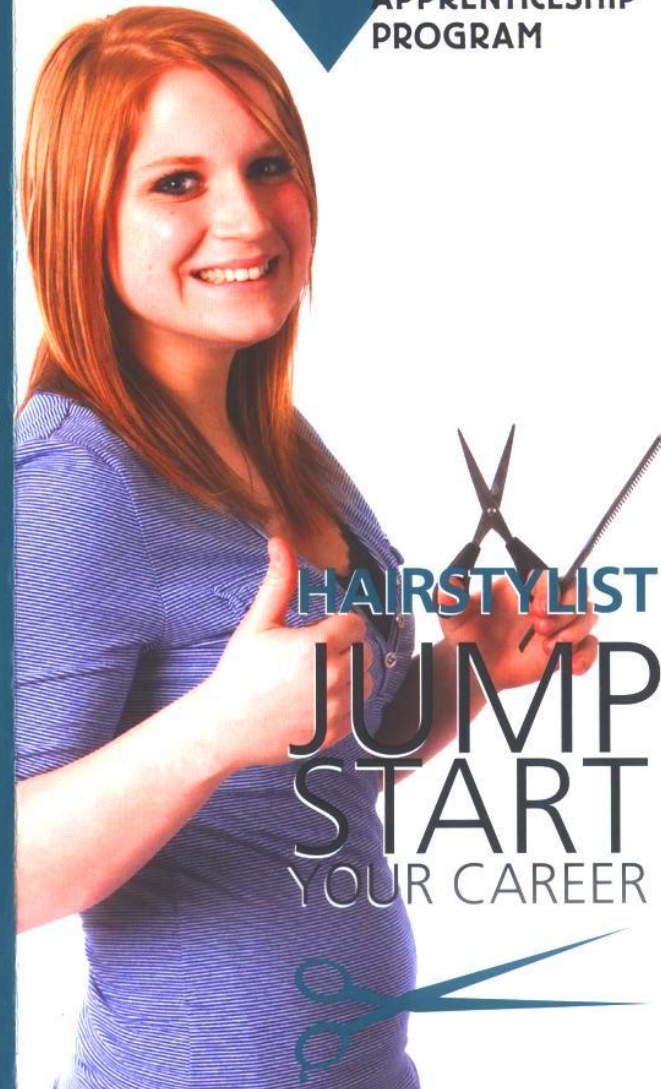

PATHWAYS

TO A HAIRSTYLIST APPRENTICESHIP

1. Register for a Cooperative Education Course

- Get the opportunity to complete your co-op in any of the skilled trade areas.
- This is an excellent opportunity to 'test' a trade to see if it's right for you!

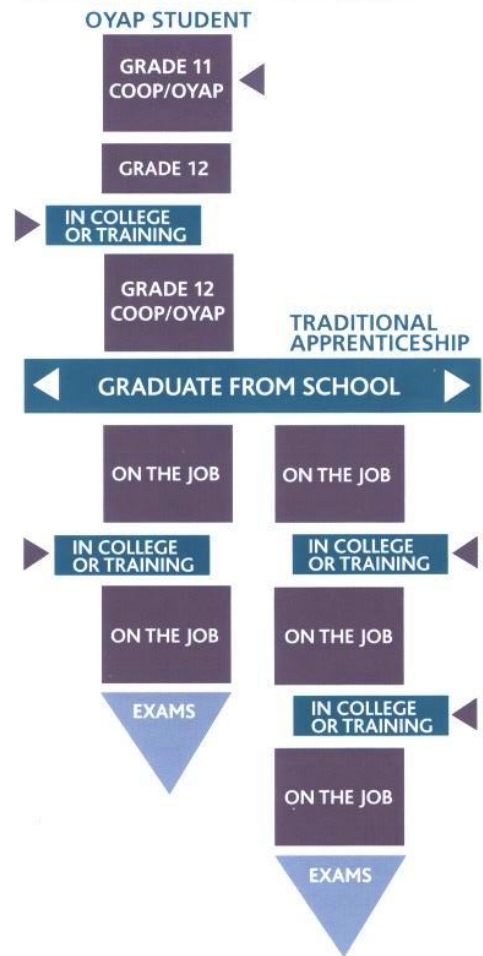
2. Registered OYAP/Co-op

- Continue your co-op placement in a skilled trade area AND get registered as an apprentice with the Ministry of Training Colleges and Universities (Apprenticeship Branch).
- The hours completed at co-op will count towards the completion of your apprenticeship program.

3. Level 1 OYAP/Co-op

- Registered apprentices may have the opportunity to complete the 1st level of the in-school portion of apprenticeship training.
- Attending St Lawrence College, Kingston in your grade 12 year, will provide an opportunity to complete the first in-school component (240 hours) of the Hairstylist Apprenticeship program.
 - Receive secondary school credits and college credits for the time spent in the cooperative education placement.
 - Receive secondary school credits and college credits for the in-school time at college as well.
 - Length of apprenticeship is 3020 hours (including TWO 360 hour in school components).
