Tender T1617-010-Parking Lot Improvement & Paving at Various Schools

Trustee Danes provided highlights on this recommendation. Earlier this year the Ministry of Education announced capital funding initiatives to support community hubs in schools and accessibility. HPEDSB has been allocated \$770,986 and the funding is proposed to be used for parking lot and paving improvements at Centennial Secondary School and Centre Hastings Secondary School. Re: Name of the new Marmora elementary school

Purpose

To seek approval for the name of the new Marmora elementary school.

Background

The Ministry of Education approved a business case, submitted by Hastings Prince Edward District School Board, to consolidate Marmora Senior Public School and Earl Prentice Public school through a renovation and addition at Marmora Senior Public School site. The consolidated school will bring together students from Earl Prentice Public School (presently JK to Grade 3) and Marmora Senior Public School (presently Grade 4 to 8) on the Marmora Senior site and will improve learning environments for students in HPEDSB. Construction on the project begins this month and with an anticipated date of completion and consolidation for March 2018.

As outlined in HPEDSB Procedure 188 Naming Board Property and under the direction of Administrative Council, a committee was established to consider the options and implications of the request to rename Marmora Senior Public School as a K-8 school.

Current situation

The Marmora School Re-naming Committee was formed including the following members: Rob Lake, Principal MSPS (co-chair); JoAnne Nitschke, Principal EP (co-chair); Nicole Larkman, Teacher MSPS; Jason Carman, Teacher EP; Christa Maloney, DECE EP; Bonnie Danes, Trustee; Ella Wagner, Student MSPS; Crystal Lahaie, Student MSPS, Judy Backus, Community Representative; Marg Kitchen, Community Representative; Lynn Servos-Post; Educational Assistant, MSPS; Theresa Gibbs; School Council Chair EP; Lee-Anne Kerr, School Council Chair MSPS; Kerry Donnell, Communications Officer; Cathy Portt, Superintendent.

The committee developed a process to communicate with the community, parents, students and staff and to engage all stakeholders in the process, providing input to re-name the soon to be renovated Marmora school. The first communication invited input and rationale for potential new names for the school through on line or paper submission. 243 responses were received which informed the decision to focus first on determining a school name and a shortened list of potential names was then developed for further input.

The second communication to stakeholders on May 15, 2017 invited a second phase of input through online or paper submission, on four potential names: Crowe Valley Public School, Crowe River Public School, Marmora Elementary School and Marmora Public School. Once again input was received from over 700 community members, parents, students and staff. Input and rationale for these options were reviewed by the committee and a final decision was made on Monday, June 5, 2017.



The proposed name for the renovated and consolidated school in Marmora is:

Marmora Public School

Rationale for this school name is as follows:

- Including Marmora in the school name represents the community and town
- The evolution of the "Marmora" in the school name has been part of the history from Marmora High School, to Marmora Senior Public School, and now, as Marmora Public School
- It is a public school
- It is a simple, straightforward name, which easily identifies where the school is located and is similar to schools in nearby towns (e.g., Tweed, Madoc, Stirling)
- Marmora Public School was most popular suggestion in the first round of input

Re: Belleville Area Accommodation Review Recommendations

Purpose

To bring recommendations to the Trustees as a result of the accommodation review process conducted in the City of Belleville.

Background

An accommodation review process was undertaken in the City of Belleville as per Policy 15: Student Enrolment/School Capacity: Pupil Accommodation Review which states that a group of schools may be considered for an accommodation review where:

- The school or group of schools will experience an adverse impact on learning opportunities for students due to declining enrolment.
- Reorganization involved the schools will enhance program and learning opportunities for students.
- One or more of the schools is experiencing higher building maintenance or renewal expenses that the average for the system and/or is in need of major capital improvements.

The purpose of the accommodation review was to recommend changes that support:

- More equitable access to program offerings.
- Enriched program offerings wherever possible.
- Continued capacity to deliver special education programs.
- Optimization of resources.

Current situation

According to Policy 15: Student Enrolment/ School Capacity: Pupil Accommodation Review, the Student Enrolment/School Capacity Committee (SE/SCC) was required to review the final report from administration and public input and prepare its recommendation to the Board. The recommendation are based on the final report and recommendations from administration, and feedback compiled from the public delegation. The SE/SCC had the discretion to approve the recommendations(s) as presented by administration or to recommendations for Board consideration.

That Hastings and Prince Edward District School Board approve the consolidation of Hillcrest School and Prince of Wales Public School at Prince of Wales Public School effective September 2017, as contained in Board Report No. B-2, dated June 19, 2017.

Recommendation #2

Moved: D. Patterson Seconded: L. Kyle

> That Hastings and Prince Edward District School Board approve, effective September 2018, the consolidation of Quinte Secondary School and Moira Secondary School at Moira Secondary School, with a rebranded name and logo; and the associated boundaries modified so that some students move to Centennial Secondary School in order to ensure an equitable distribution of students for programming purposes; and seek Ministry of Education funding/approval to build a new Grade 9-12 secondary school in Belleville in consultation with the City of Belleville. Potential locations could include the Queen Elizabeth Public School (Belleville) property or another location in the east end of Belleville.

Harry J. Clarke Public School students would remain at the current site.

Should funding/approval for a new build not be approved, seek Ministry of Education funding/approval for an addition/renovation to Queen Elizabeth Public School (Belleville) to consolidate queen Elizabeth Public School (Belleville) and Queen Victoria School at the Queen Elizabeth Public School (Belleville) site, as contained in Board Report No. B-2, dated June 19, 2017.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO MEET CURRENT EXPENDITURES OF HASTINGS AND PRINCE EDWARD DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD (the "Board")

- A. In accordance with Section 243 (1) of the Education Act (R.S.O. 1990) (the AAct@), the board considers it necessary to borrow the amount of up to \$12,000,000 to meet, until current revenues are received, the current expenditures of the Board for the period commencing on September 1, 2017 and ending on August 31, 2018 (the "period").
- B. Pursuant to subsection 243 (3) of the Act, the total amount borrowed pursuant to this resolution together with the total of any similar borrowings is not to exceed the unreceived balance of the estimated revenues of the Board for the period.
- C. The total amount previously borrowed by the Board pursuant to Section 243 that has not been repaid is \$0.
- D. The amount borrowed for current expenditures is within the board's Debt and Financial Obligation Limit as established by the Ministry of Education and Training from time to time.

RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Chairman or Vice-Chairman and the Treasurer are authorized on behalf of the board to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note or bankers' acceptance from CANADIAN IMPERIAL BANK OF COMMERCE ("CIBC") a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate of \$12,000,000 to meet, until current revenues are received, the current expenditures of the board for the period (including the amounts required for the purposes mentioned in Section 243 (1) and 243 (2) of the Act) and to give to CIBC promissory notes or bankers' acceptances, as the case may be, sealed with the corporate seal of the board and signed by the Chairman or Vice Chairman and the Treasurer for the sums borrowed plus interest at a rate to be agreed upon from time to time with CIBC;
- 2. The interest charged, on all sums borrowed pursuant to this resolution plus any related charges, is not to exceed the interest that would be payable at the prime lending rate of the chartered banks listed in Schedule 1 of the Bank Act (Canada) on the date of borrowing;
- 3. The Treasurer is authorized and directed to apply in payment of all sums borrowed plus interest, all of the moneys collected or received in respect of the current revenues of the board;
- 4. The Treasurer is authorized and directed to deliver to CIBC from time to time upon request a statement showing (a) the total amount of unpaid previous borrowings of the board for current expenditures together with debt charges, if any, and (b) the uncollected balance of the estimated revenues for the current year or, where the estimates have not been adopted, the estimated revenues of the previous year less any current revenue already collected.

Re: Policy/Program Memorandum No. 131: Home Schooling

Purpose

Policy/Program Memorandum No. 131 provides direction to school boards and schools concerning policies related to home schooling and the excusing of children from school who are receiving home schooling.

Background

PPM 131 states: Procedures for Parents

Parents who decide to provide home schooling for their child(ren) should notify the school board of their intents in writing. Parents should provide the name, gender, and date of birth of each child who is receiving home schooling, and the telephone number and address of the home. The letter should be signed by the parent(s).

If parents decide to continue to provide home schooling in subsequent years, they <u>should</u> give notification each year in writing prior to September 1 to the school board in whose jurisdiction their child last attended school. The letter <u>should</u> contain the same information as that in the initial letter described above.

Procedures for School Boards

When parents give a board written notification of their intent to provide home schooling for their child, the board <u>should</u> consider the child to be excused from attendance at school, in accordance with subsection 21(2), clause (a), of the Education Act. The board <u>should</u> accept the written notification of the parents each year as evidence that the parents are providing satisfactory instruction at home..... Normally, the board <u>should</u> not investigate the matter. However, if there are reasonable grounds to suspect that the child is not receiving satisfactory instruction at home, the board <u>should</u> take steps to determine whether the instruction is satisfactory,"

Current situation

As part of the Ministry of Education's discussion paper to Strengthen Education in Ontario's Rural and Remote Communities, Trustees have been invited to contribute feedback. A point of discussion with some communities is that if students who were home schooled attended schools in rural areas it could support more healthy enrolments.

The language in PPM 131 is not strong enough to encourage parents to register their children in the public school system and should be amended to do so.
