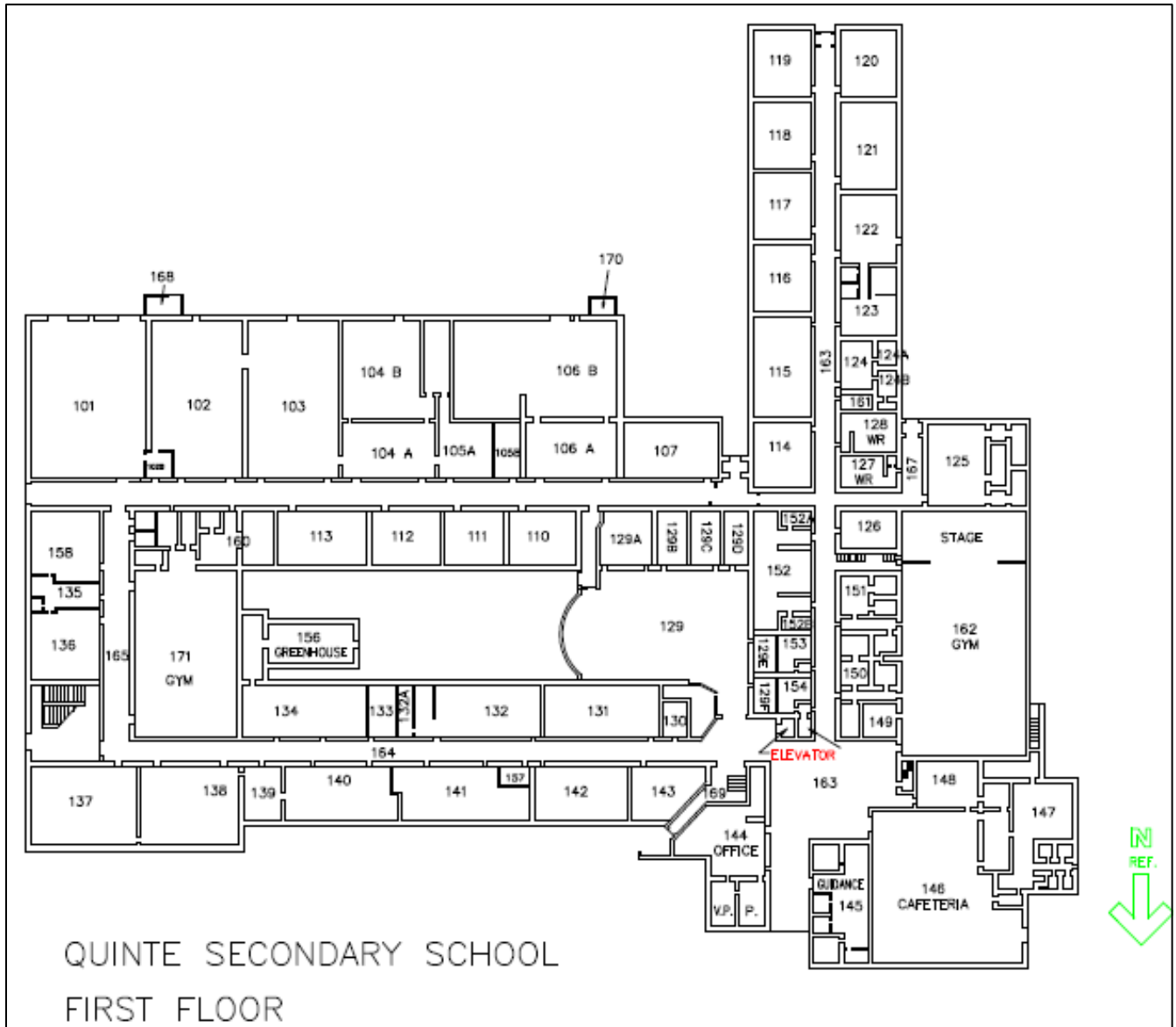

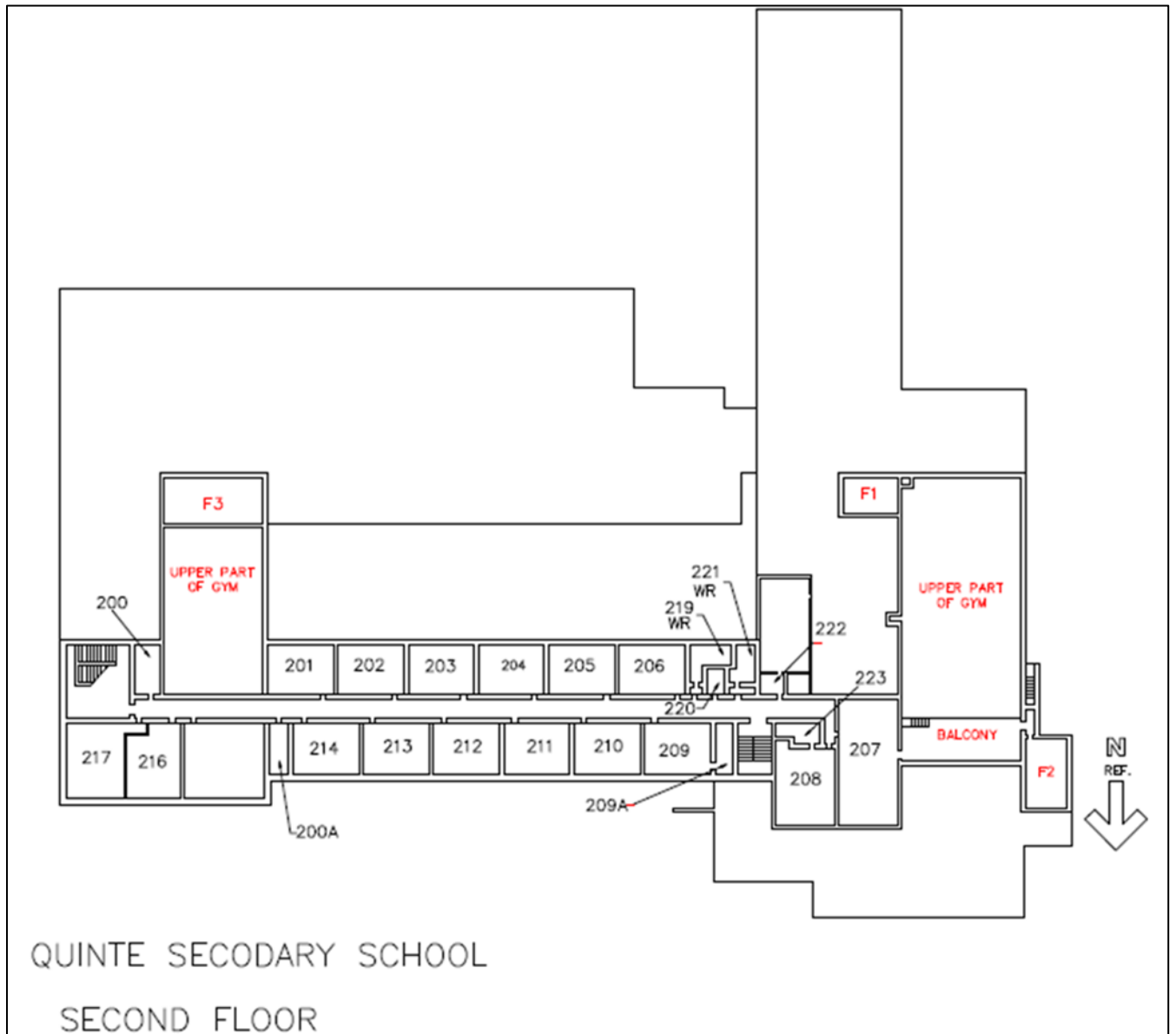

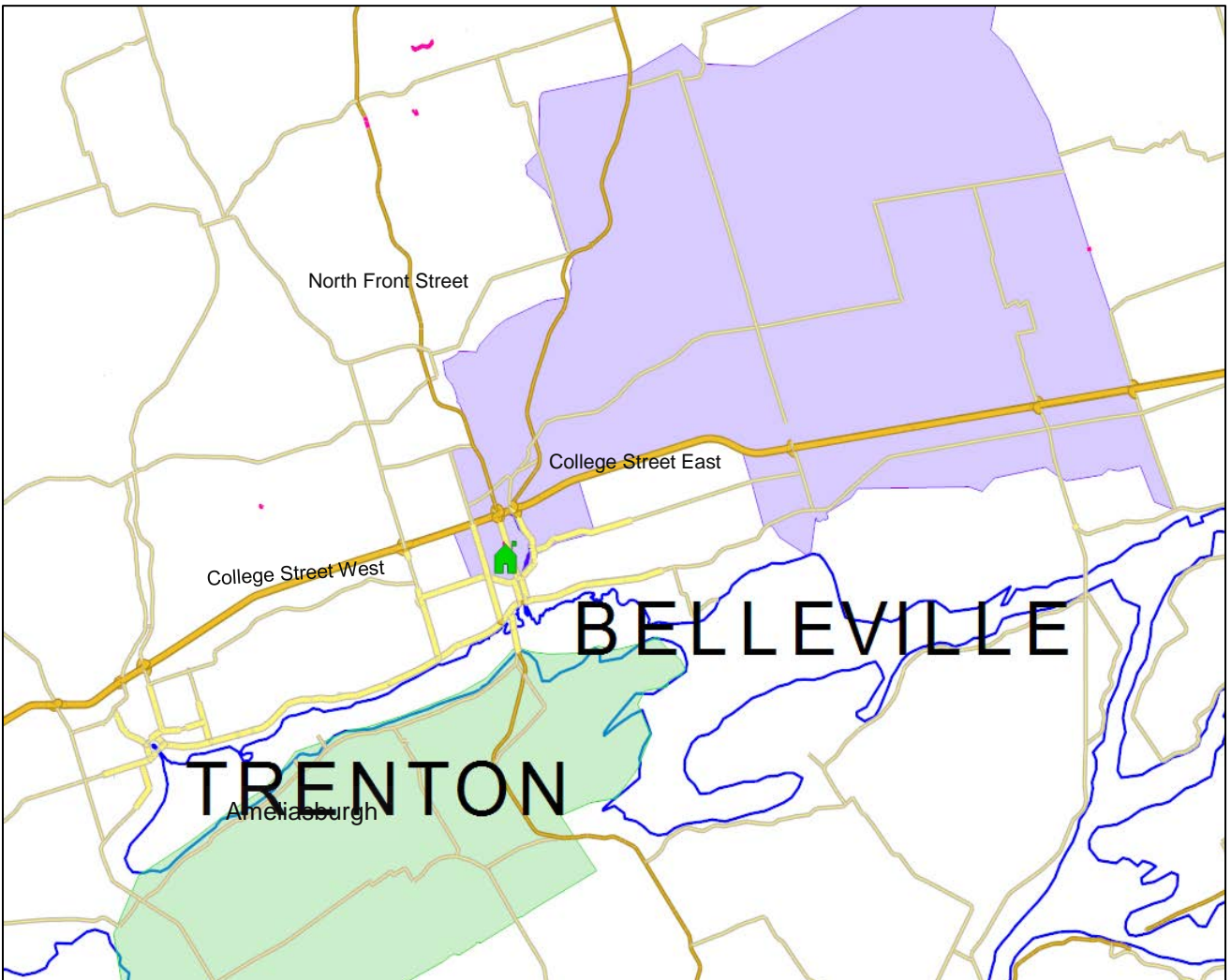

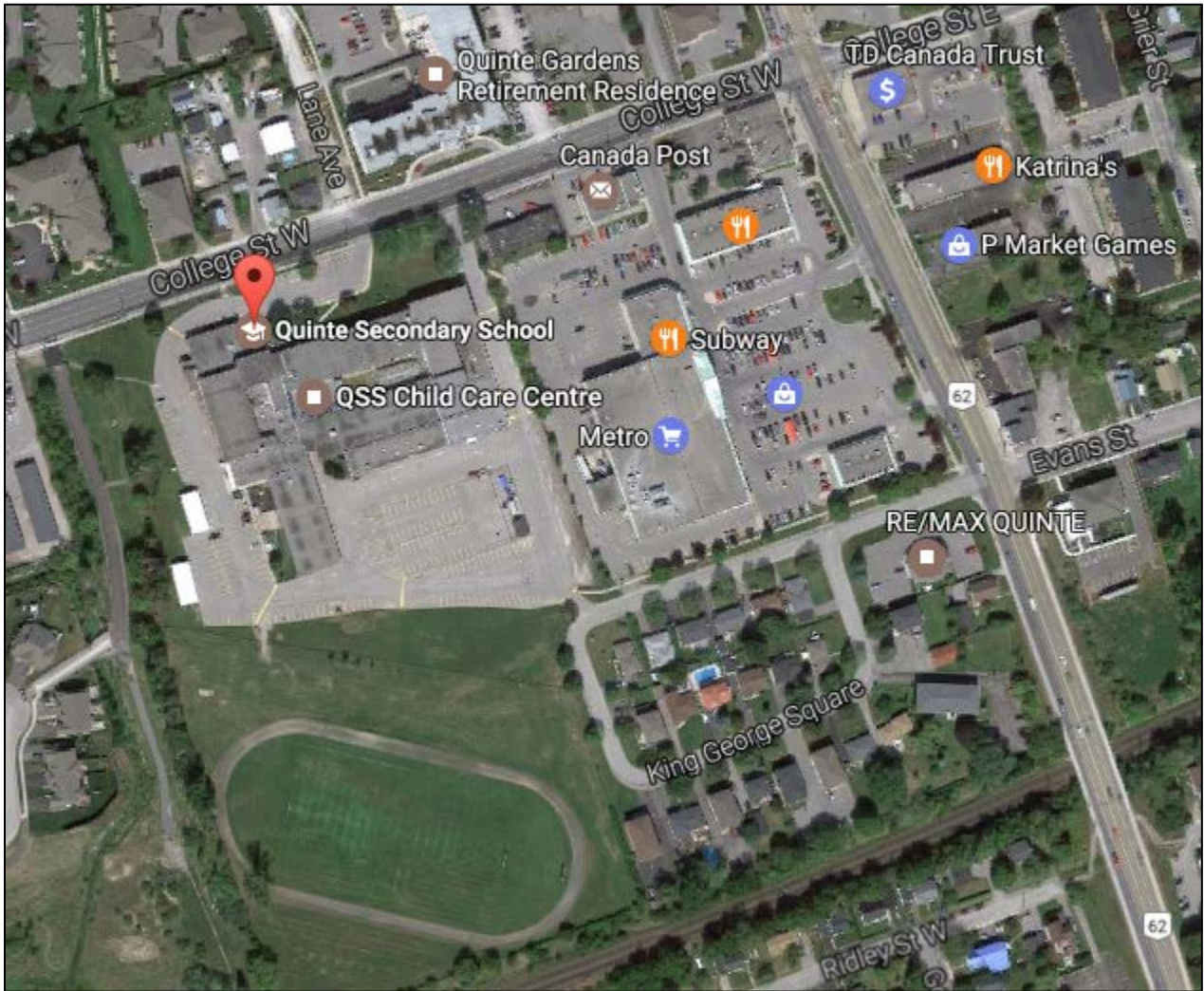
iii) Attendance Boundary

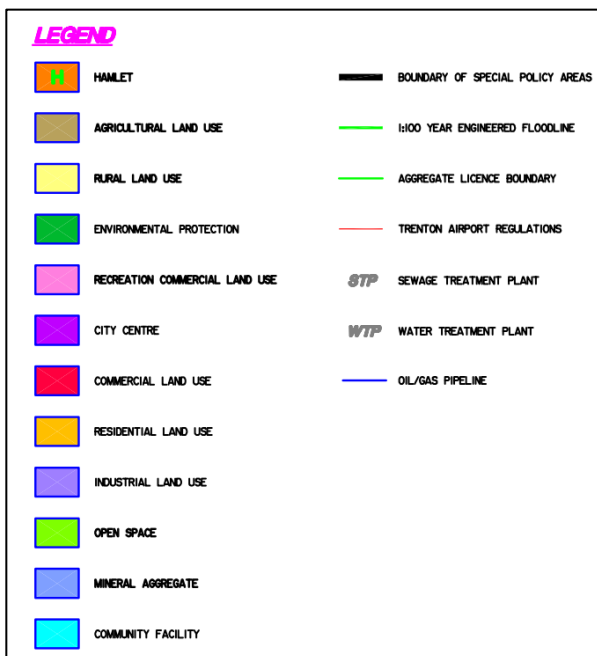

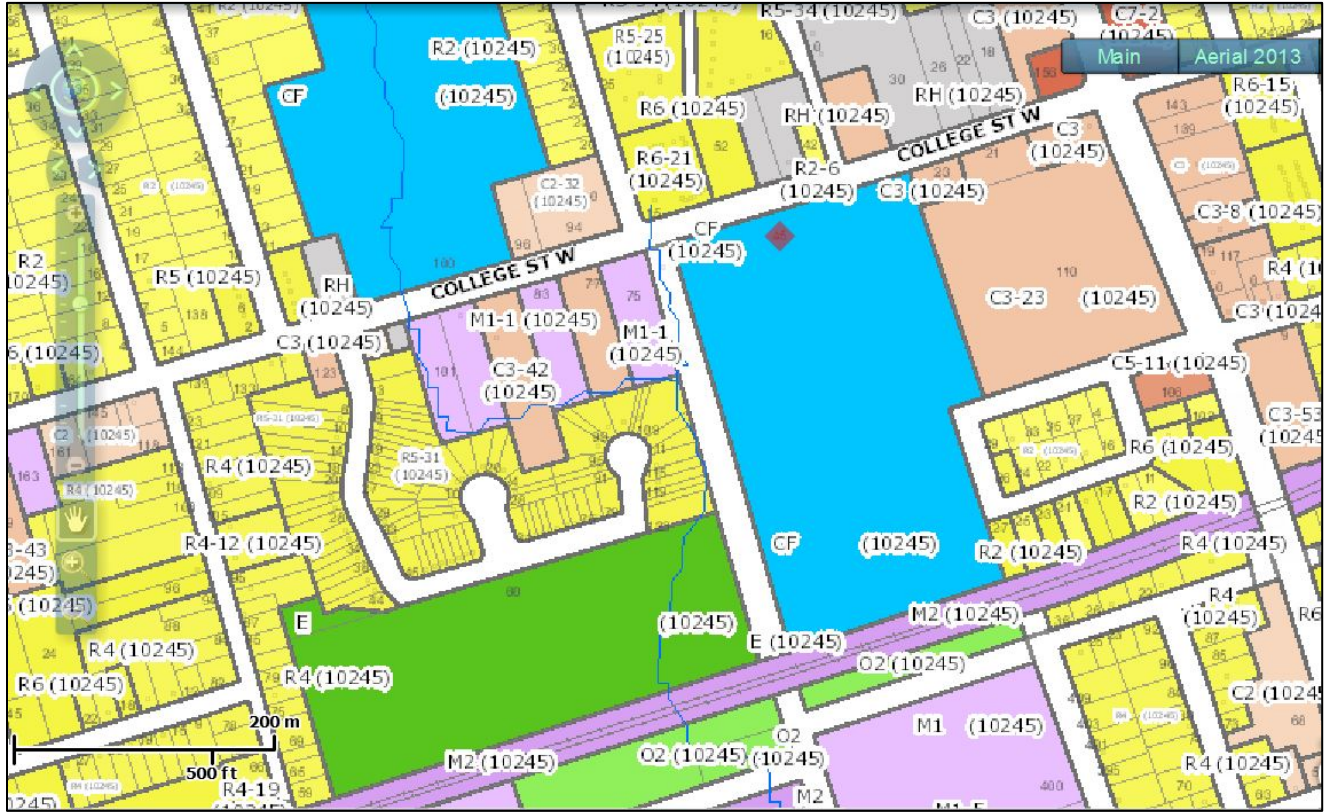
v) Official Plan Land Use Designation Map
